ESSENTIAL OIL SPRAYS FOR THE HOMESTEAD

1

SQUEAKY
CLEAN
COOP

COOP CLEANING SPRAY

20 drops Peppermint oil
10 drops Tea Tree oil
1/2 cup white vinegar

Combine above ingredients in a spray bottle. Add water to top. Shake before spraying.

Great for cleaning, disinfecting and bug control.

FLY SPRAY

20 drops Lavender oil
10 drops Cedarwood oil
10 drops Lemongrass, Peppermint OR
Rosemary

Combine above oils in a spray bottle and fill with water. Shake well before spraying around coop and other outside areas where flies congregate.

PLANT FUNGUS SPRAY

6-8 drops Tea Tree oil
2 cups water

Add to spray bottle and spray directly on infected leaves 2-3 times per week.

Avoid spraying in hot sun to help prevent burning.



4 NESTBOX SWEET NESTBOX

NEST BOX SPRAY

Combine FIVE DROPS EACH of 2-4 of the following oils:

peppermint, rosemary, sage, spearmint, thyme, in a spray bottle.

Fill with water. Shake before using. Spray LIGHTLY around or near the nest box area to help control bugs, support calming, and hen health.



Don't saturate the nest box with spray and don't go overboard. A little goes a long way.

5 TOMATO MEGGA BOOSTER

BASIL SPRAY (COMPANION PLANT)

Add 6-8 drops Basil oil to 2 gallons warm water and stir.

Fill a watering can half full with this mixture and then top with cold water.



Stir and water plants. Use this 2x week to bring beneficial aid to tomato plants.

6 DEER AND RABBIT BE GONE!


SAVE THE GARDEN SPRAY


Add 6-8 drops of one of the following oils to spray bottle:

Thyme, Peppermint, Wintergreen.

Fill with water and spray around plants in your garden that you want to protect from deer and rabbits eating.

Reapply as needed and after rain and/or watering.
